7. Discussion hiring law firm for representation for solar and wind farms abatement agreement County Attorney Sterling Burleson addressed the court with the option of hiring a law firm that specializes in tax abatement agreements.

8. Discuss and possible action regarding lease of oil, gas and mineral rights

County Attorney Sterling Burleson was contacted by Dustin Riley, land man, about leasing property near County Road 280. The county owns part of the mineral interest in narrow strips of land, about 14 acres. Burleson advised the court to request sealed bids to lease the rights.
